About this role

This is a part-time, permanent position (21.6 hours per week) with a salary scale of £26,881 – £28,950 (pro rata).

The Programming Producer is a newly created role at Play to the Crowd, offering a unique opportunity to contribute to the ongoing evolution of the organisation's artistic programme. Working closely with the CEO/Artistic Director, the post is central to curating the received professional programme at Theatre Royal Winchester, with a focus on growing audiences, maximising earned income, and maintaining an artistically rich and balanced season.

Key responsibilities include researching, filtering, shortlisting, and recommending programming options, as well as leading on the administration and delivery of the theatre's community hirers' performance programme.

The role also encompasses efficient management of the professional programme's logistics — including drafting and overseeing contracts, coordinating with visiting companies, and collaborating with front of house and technical teams — to ensure seamless communication and a high-quality experience for artists and audiences alike.



What you will do

Professional Programming

- Research, filter, shortlist and recommend programming options for Theatre Royal Winchester including scouting for work where possible
- Work closely with the CEO/Artistic Director to make choices and curate the programme with a clear eye on the expenditure budget and income targets, as well as the artistic and art form balance of the programme
- Work closely with the CEO/Artistic Director to explore programming options for other spaces locally
- Take particular responsibility for programming a specific genre or space, if in line with personal expertise and experience
- Specifically look for and flag opportunities where the professional programme could enhance our community engagement work or benefit our priority communities. Liaise with colleagues internally to explore the logistics and help make this happen
- Manage and coordinate accessible performances, ensuring these happen in line with Business Plan targets
- Work alongside the CEO/Artistic Director to negotiate cost efficient deals with selected artists for our platforms
- Manage the contracting process ensuring clarity and efficience
- Support the creative team of our pantomime with sourcing professional performers, community ensemble and production roles as required


What you will do

Community Hirings Programme

- Lead on managing the relationship with our community hirers and be the lead contact for these
- Agree the details of the contracts and issue these contracts alongside other supporting documentation and guidance
- Liaise internally to ensure they have the best possible experience and feel well supported
- Ensure planning and wash up meetings happen as required with the right people present
- Maximise the income from this strand while balancing the needs of the overall programme and the needs of the community users

Communication and Administration

- Manage the programming inbox effectively to make collaborative programming decisions easier by identifying work both by genre and date availability
- Manage our Programming Master, Show Calendar and Sharepoint programming folders efficiently and accurately, supporting others to do so too, where required
- Communicate promptly and effectively with incoming proposals and with artists once programmed, as well as after their performances with us
- Administrate the contracting process and ensure effective communication is maintained both with our visiting artists and with internal functions
- Use spreadsheets to calculate the financial implications of deals and pricing
- Work particularly closely with Marketing, Technical and Front of House internally to ensure seamless administration of the programme, acting as a coordinator and single point of contact where required.
- Liaise with our Finance Manager to ensure timely and accurate settlements
- Work closely with our People and Policies Manager and our CEO/Artistic Director to administrate our own produced pantomime including managing contracts and communication for and with the core creative team
